Drought Bout

The rhyme above is a gist of the reality at New Gokula! Even though the coast has seen rain (heavy or light) on many occasions, we have received only a minimalistic amount here in the past eight months. Whilst New Gokula has not been exempted from the inauspicious effects of the present godless atmosphere of Kali Yuga, devotees nevertheless have faith in the *yuga dharma* (duty for this age) of *sankirtan yajna* (congregational chanting of Hare Krishna *maha mantra*).

Many of you are aware that New Gokula is also a farm community besides boasting a temple for the most beautiful deities of Sri Sri Radha Gokulananda. So our gamut of activities and requirement of resources (for example: Water) is much more than city temples.



Water is not only essential for the devotees and visitors but equally so for our beautiful cows, handsome bulls, cheeky goats, and all the other flora and fauna on our 500-odd acres of land. And the favourite food for cows is grass, which also provides them with the necessary minerals and vitamins they require to sustain themselves. With drought conditions and onset of winter now, the pastures are so dry that hardly any grass grows.

Moving forward, devotees are being proactive to come out of the drought wiser and more prepared. The installation of a 60hp pump by Manapati das and Bhakta Wayne along with



irrigation has enabled cultivation of one hectare of winter

barley to supplement fodder needs. Further, water experts are lending their skills and equipment to test the quality and feasibility of using bore water.

In the meantime our cow man, Sesha das has been active training 2 sets of bullocks who are looking highly promising to execute the work of ploughing in the traditional way as shown by the Lord Himself.

buy further supply of hay to take us into spring, which will cost a further \$15,000 at least.

The farm component of New Gokula, due to its nature of diverse activities: be it caring for animals; priestly work; growing food; administration; water management; pasture management; construction

etc. allows the engagement of every class of society – *Brahmanas, Ksatriyas, Vaisyas* and *Sudras* – the true *Varnasrama* system, as opposed to the limited urban set-up. Though we are not completely there yet, a move in the right direction has been made to make Srila Prabhupada's dream of a proper Vedic community manifest - step by step.

One of the steps in this direction has been to have Working Bees at the farm enabling groups from all walks





of life to come together and perform various services on the farm helping us complete certain projects. One particular *Bhakti Vrksha* group from Parramatta led by His Grace Anandamaya Gopinath das has been exceptional in their support – physically and financially for the past year. Consistently they have turned up at the farm every 4-6 weeks with the men helping to repair fences, dig trenches, pick up cow dung, clear the paddocks of rubbish, gardening, and recently even pouring a concrete floor in the goshala.
